Dr. Park is the executive sponsor for the hospital's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee that helps ensure health equity for our patients and community as well as cultivating the diverse workforce engagement. She also oversees Transitions of Care, Readmissions, IDR and Throughput efficiency, and Case Management and Social Work. Dr. Park is also the lead for Age-Friendly Care for the hospital, ensuring a comprehensive equitable and quality care for our older adults. She oversees and has created several other clinical and operational programs in the hospital and health system. Dr. Park is active in education of healthcare professionals including the Zucker School of Medicine and Hofstra School of Nursing and Physician Assistants

Dr. Park is the founding chair of Asian Bridges BERG at Northwell Health with over 600 members which was created to help "bridge" relationships with Asian communities and Northwell Health, and to be cultural ambassadors within the organization. She implemented a health system's physician language referral guide with over 16 languages to promote language and culture concordant care for patients, the first of its kind in New York, and helped create physician networking groups based on language and culture. She active in local and national organizations for the Korean community, serves on the board for KCS. Dr. Park is passionate about culturally competent and equitable care for the most vulnerable population especially for the elderly and immigrant populations within the health system and in the community.

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Dr. Park established a dynamic interdisciplinary Geri-Palliative Care team with the help of two successful grants from the Fan Fox and Leslie Samuels Foundation. She created and maintained many vital projects such as the Advance Illness programs, helped the hospital be the first in the health system to achieve the status of Committed to Excellence in Age Friendly Care, implemented the GOH-CO (geriatric orthopedic hospitalist medicine co-management) program, and started Schwartz Rounds and Team Lavender for the hospital staff.
