Sarah C. Nosal, MD, FAAFP, is Vice President for Innovation & Optimization and Chief Medical Information Officer at The Institute for Family Health, a federally qualified health center network with 27+ Mid-Hudson, Bronx, Manhattan, and Brooklyn locations. In her nearly two decades of practice in the South Bronx, Nosal has consistently achieved top quality performance metrics in her organization. As CMIO, she secured financial support for IT infrastructure, chaired the clinical committee of the largest public health information exchange in the nation and helped her institution become a regional leader in data sharing and ensuring equitable information access.



Nosal serves on The Institute's Graduate Medical Education Committee which is responsible for monitoring and advising all aspects of residency education and ensuring full compliance with ACGME institutional and RRC programs across three family medicine residencies. From rural/suburban Mid-Hudson, urban Harlem and urban Downtown residency programs she centers efforts around quality improvement and patient safety. Nosal is assistant professor at the Mount Sinai Department of Family Medicine & Community Health, where she focuses on the care of marginalized communities and the uninsured and shares the role of medical director for Einstein Community Health Outreach student-run free clinic.

Nosal has been an active member of the Medical Society of the State of New York (MSSNY) since she was a medical student. During medical school she served as a MSSNY- Medical Student Section(MSS) Delegate to the American Medical Association (AMA) House of Delegates (HOD) and served on an AMA reference committee while representing MSSNY-MSS. Nosal was an active member of the Young Physician Section (YPS) throughout her early career, serving as the YPS representative to the Committee on Preventive Medicine & Family Health on which she now serves as co-chair. Nosal has served as chair of the MSSNY Primary Care Caucus and in the Bronx County Medical Society as secretary, vice-president and president-elect, and repeatedly as BxCMS Delegate or Alternate to the MSSNY HOD.

Nosal, is a member of the board of directors of the American Academy of Family Physicians. The AAFP represents 129,600 physicians and medical students nationwide. A member of the AAFP since 2004, she has served as chair of the AAFP Commission on Membership and Member Services and chair of the commission's Special Constituencies Subcommittee. She was also the lead member in the awards discussion of the AAFP Commission on Membership & Membership Services. In 2014 Nosal served as convener of the National Conference of Special Constituencies. Nosal's earliest New York State Academy of Family Physicians (NYSAFP) role was as resident delegate to the NYSAFP Congress of Delegates. She subsequently served the NYSAFP Board of Directors in numerous roles, including as president of the state academy and most recently as NYSAFP delegate to the AAFP Congress of Delegates.

Nosal earned her Bachelor of Arts degrees in biology and psychology from Bryn Mawr College in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania. She earned her medical degree from Albert Einstein College of Medicine in Bronx, New York. She completed her residency in Urban Family Practice at Beth Israel Medical Center & Institute for Family Health, New York, New York.

Nosal is board certified by the American Board of Family Medicine and also certified in HIV medicine and boarded in Clinical Informatics through the American Board of Preventive Medicine. She has the AAFP Degree of Fellow, an earned degree awarded to family physicians for distinguished service and continuing medical education.
