A practicing physician and long-time advocate for health equity and population health, Dr. Clark brings over 25 years of experience in preventive medicine and public health to her leadership position as President and Chief Executive Officer and Chief Medical Officer of Anthony L. Jordan Health Corp. She provides strategic guidance to the organization around medical, behavioral and social programming, including planning an agenda of advocacy, grant writing and community partnerships. She is responsible for setting a vision for the high quality service brought to patients with dignity and respect, regardless of their ability to pay.

Dr. Clark is a research assistant professor in SUNY Buffalo's Department of Epidemiology and Environmental Health and Public Health and an adjunct assistant professor in Public Health Sciences at University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry. Clark has chaired the annual Faith and Medicine Working Together to Eliminate Health Disparities conference since 2012 and now provides visionary leadership for the Speak Life! Health Equity Conference.

Active in community-based organizations and in the medical community, Dr. Clark, co-founder, served in several capacities, including the chair, of the Board of Directors for the Black Physicians Network, from its inception in 2015 until 2022. This mission of this organization is to decrease health disparities and improve community health through an increase in Black physicians. Mentorship and advocacy of those on the pathway to medical careers continues through work guiding a Pipeline (Pathway) Task Force. She sits on the Committee on Health Equity of the Medical Society of The State of New York (MSSNY) as a prior chair, and the Monroe County Medical Society's (MCMS) Quality Committee. She is the founding chair of the Equity and Diversity Committee of the MCMS.

Honors for her community service include the Rochester Martin Luther King, Jr. Commission's *Raymond L. Graves Beloved Community Award*, the *Woman of Distinction Award* from Girl Scouts of Western N.Y., Chi Eta Phi Founder's Day *Community Leader Award*, the UPrep *Woman of Substance Award*, the Rochester Area Task Force Association's *Clinician of the Year Award*, and most recently, The Rev. Dr. Weldon Thomas *Faith and Medicine Award*.
