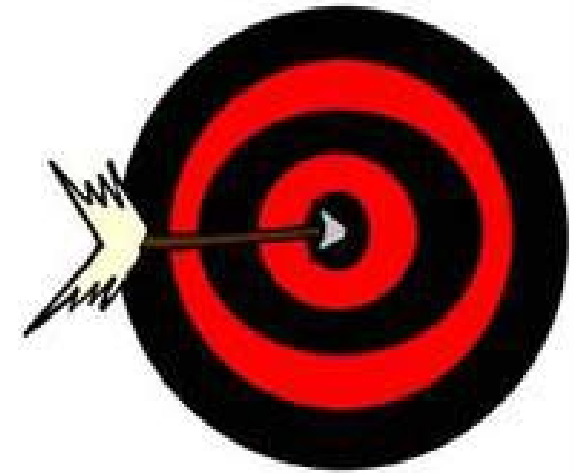

- There are readily available inventories, so use them to know more about yourself, your style, your passions (and your shortcomings)





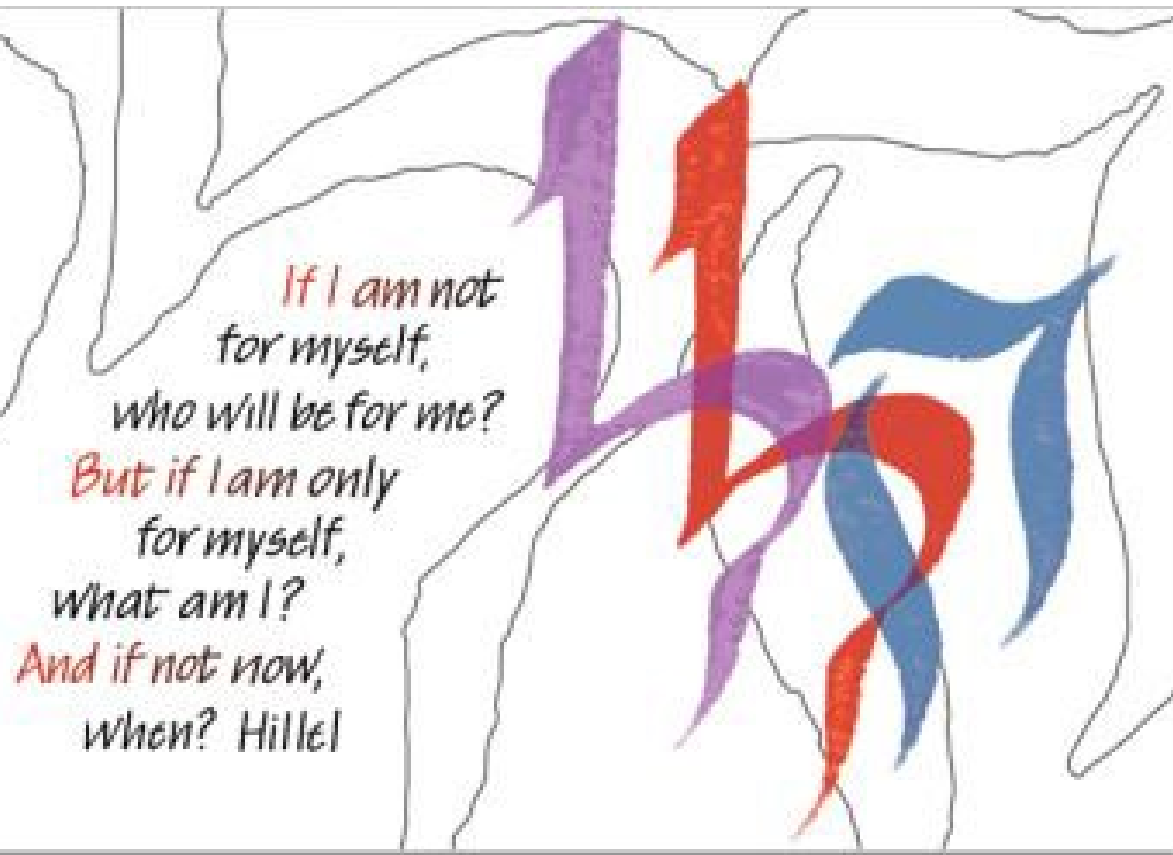
Balance!!!
